

EARS - Have you seen how a pony is always moving his ears forward and back, and from side to side. He can hear very well, especially when his ears are turned in the direction that the noise is coming from. He also holds his ears in certain positions to send messages.

EYES - Your pony has very big eyes, and can see things far away. He can also see well in the dark.

NOSTRILS - Those nostrils can very easily smell if you have a carrot in your hand, and can smell if his food is mouldy.

MANE - The mane can be long or short, and like your hair, it can be thin or very thick.

TAIL - Your pony swishes his tail to chase away flies. Keep out of the way if he is swishing a lot, because if you feel it on your skin, it stings!

HOOF - This is the horse's foot - don't forget, there are four!
