Having started with the details of the exact location of the site so that the emergency services can be told where they are required we start our assessment at the entrance to the site.

- How will this affect other road users?
- Will vehicles be able to leave the public road at a reasonable pace (walking speed) and will they be a hazard to people already on site as they enter the site?
- What arrangements have been made to ensure that members, officials and instructors know where to go?
- Is anyone going to use a vehicle during the rally, if so is it really necessary?
- How are horses and pedestrians going to move about the site, take particular note of the start and finish of the rally?
- Access for first aid vehicles must also be considered at this stage, may only be for an ambulance to collect a casualty
- Are there public rights of way, footpaths or bridleways across or at the boundary of the site?
- What action can or needs to be taken to stop a loose horse leaving the site and going onto a public road?

- Are details of location (Post Code, Map Reference) known by first aider and organiser?

Matching horses to riders	The horse or pony must be of a suitable size and temperament to match the capabilities of the rider.  There must be enough horses or ponies for the number of riders, so that no pony is excessively worked on the day, excessive being defined as not exceeding what is usual, proper, necessary, or normal, and the horses or ponies used must be fit for purpose. Some sharing of ponies is allowed, but not excessively so.  Other: Stirrups must fit the rider.	PC Members PC Officials Parents General Public Animals Property	<ul> <li>Horses or ponies that are too strong for their riders are a danger to themselves, to the rider and to spectators if control is lost. The use of strong bits or tightly fastened martingales is NOT encouraged to increase control. Rather swop the pony for another more suitable. The pony may be useable by a stronger, more experienced rider</li> <li>No pony to have more than 3 riders, be asked to ride a course or short class or practice ride more than 3 times. Ponies and horses must be untacked and rested between riders. Riders are not allowed to use horses and ponies as chairs; once the rider is finished the pony or horse must be untacked immediately and cooled down appropriately and given access to water and grazing</li> <li>This may require stirrups to be swopped between riders</li> </ul>	HIGH SIGNIFICANT ACCEPTABLE LOW
