OBJECTIVES

- * To work towards becoming an educated and practical horseman
- * To be able to look after ponies kept at grass and have experience and knowledge of looking after stabled horses
- * To be able to ride at all paces over fences and varying terrain
- * To be able to ride a well-mannered horse or pony out hunting, or on an endurance or fun ride, and be able to prepare him before the day and care for him afterwards
- * To have a knowledge of pace, distance and discipline to ride intelligently and safely in a group or alone
- * Ride with due regard for others in the country and on the roads
- * To be able to ride safely on the public highway

RIDING AND ROAD SENSE

- 1. Mount from a mounting block on either side.
- 2. Be in balance with the horse at all paces.
- 3. Maintain balance when changing diagonals.
- 4. Know the aids for turns and circles.
- 5. Be able to carry a schooling whip in either hand and move it correctly from hand to hand.
- 6. Discuss whether there is any loss of balance during transitions.
- 7. Be able to perform a quarter turn on the forehand and know the correct aids.
- 8. Be able to change the rein with the reins in one hand.
- 9. Know the sequence of footfalls in trot.
- 10. Be able to jump a variety of fences and ditches out of trot and canter.
- 11. Know the signals to give when overtaking and negotiating junctions.
- 12. Know which common road signs must be obeyed and which signs are warning signs only.
- 13. Be able to ride Major to Minor, and Minor to Major road junctions.
- 14. Be able to describe a Stop, and a Give Way sign.
- 15. Know how, and who, to thank when riding on the road.
- 16. Know Countryside Access guidelines.

HORSEMASTERSHIP

- 17. Know how to prepare a grass kept pony for riding at all times of year.
- 18. Know different types of bedding and give reasons for choosing one particular type.
- 19. Know why it is important that stabled horses spend some time out at grass each day.
- 20. Know the rules of feeding and why they are important.
- 21. Have a thorough knowledge of all the items in a grooming kit, and use them effectively.
- 22. Know the differences between grooming a grass kept and a stable kept pony.
- 23. Demonstrate putting on and taking off a variety of rugs with different fastenings.
- 24. Identify different types of bandages.

- 25. Know why padding must be put underneath bandages.
- 26. Know the bones inside the foot.
- 27. Know which tools the farrier uses when removing a shoe.
- 28. Describe a hunter or general purpose shoe.
- 29. Know what to check to see that a bridle fits comfortably.
- 30. Know the names and actions of the more commonly known bits.
- 31. Recognise when a pony is in good or poor condition.
- 32. Recognize symptoms of illness.
- 33. Know when a horse should be isolated.
- 34. Know how to care for a wound until the vet arrives.
