## **OBJECTIVES**

- \* To work towards becoming an educated and practical horseman
- \* To be able to look after ponies kept at grass and have experience and knowledge of looking after stabled horses
- \* To be able to ride at all paces over fences and varying terrain
- \* To be able to ride a well-mannered horse or pony out hunting, or on an endurance or fun ride, and be able to prepare him before the day and care for him afterwards
- \* To have a knowledge of pace, distance and discipline to ride intelligently and safely in a group or alone
- \* Ride with due regard for others in the country and on the roads
- \* To be able to ride safely on the public highway

## **RIDING AND ROAD SENSE**

- 1. Dismount from the "incorrect" side.
- 2. Have a correct position at all paces.
- 3. Maintain a balanced position when changing from rising to sitting trot to rising trot.
- 4. Know and be able to explain the aids for transitions, to and from, halt, walk, trot and canter.
- 5. Be able to halt squarely and salute.
- 6. Be able to ride with the reins in one hand.
- 7. Know which rein controls the pace.
- 8. Name the Scale of Training.
- 9. Carry and use a short whip appropriately and effectively.
- 10. Be able to maintain a correct and balanced position when riding up and down hills.
- 11. Maintain a correct jumping position around a course of jumps max height 75cm.
- 12. Identify which was the best fence jumped, and why?
- 13. What is the name and action of the bit of the horse/pony you are riding?
- 14. Know how to ride safely on the roads in pairs and in groups.
- 15. Know whose instructions must be obeyed when riding on the road.
- 16. Know what to carry when hacking out on the roads.
- 17. Know how to Look, Signal, Look Again (Life Saver Look), Manoeuvre.
- 18. Be able to ride left and right turns with the correct hand signals.
- 19. Know the sequence of traffic lights.

## **HORSEMASTERSHIP**

- 20. Know what is required to keep a pony living out at grass in terms of field size, quality of grazing, shelter, and water.
- 21. Recognise good and poor stabling.
- 22. Know why it is important to keep a stabled pony well exercised.

- 23. Know the rules of watering and why water is important.
- 24. Identify a variety of indoor and outdoor rugs explaining their different uses.
- 25. Be able to put on a stable bandage.
- 26. Know the reasons for putting on stable bandages.
- 27. Know the external parts of the foot.
- 28. Name the farrier's tools.
- 29. Know what to look for when checking saddles and bridles for safety.
- 30. Be able to name the families of bits as shown in The Manual of Horsemanship.
- 31. Know the signs of good and poor health.
- 32. Know how to clean a wound.
- 33. Know when to call the vet.
